ORDINANCE NO. 10.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CASTLEFORD, TWIN FALLS COUNTY, IDAHO, APPROPRIATING THE SEVERAL SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE VILLAGE OF CASTLEFORD, IDAHO.: DESIGNATING THE DIFFERENT FUNDS TO WHICH ALL REVENUES SHALL ACCRUE AND FROM WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS SHALL BE MADE, EXPENDITURES AUTHORIZED AND WARRANTS DRAWN ON THE VILLAGE TREASURER FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF MAY, 1942, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF APRIL 1943: AND PROVIDING THE TIME THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CASTLEFORD, IDAHO:

Section 1. The General Fund is hereby designated as the proper fund into which all revenues accruing to the Village of Castleford, Idaho, from fines, licences and by taxation during the fiscal year beginning on the first day of May, 1942, and ending at the close of business on the last day of April, 1943, shall be paid, for the payment of salaries, bond premiums, and insurance, supplies, printing and publishing, general miscellaneous expenses, fire hydrants, fire and alarm siren, power and light, and streets and alleys.

Section 2. The following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the several purposes for which the money accruing to said fund shall be collected, to-wit:

Officers salaries.	\$115.00
Bonds and Insurance.	220.00
Office supplies.	50.00
Printing and publishing.	55.00
General miscellaneous expense.	69.35
Fire Hydrants.	50.00
Fire and alarm siren.	50.00
Power and light.	252.00
Streets and alleys.	140.00
Total	\$796.35

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication, and shall be known as the Annual Appropriation Bill for the fiscal year 1942-1943
